

## HCC Nursing Admission Criteria Scoring

**The applicant\* is responsible for:**

- Meeting Highland Community College admission requirements;
- Providing the required application for nursing admission to the nursing coordinator;
- Submitting required documentation for nursing admission to the nursing coordinator, as follows:
  - Active CNA documentation;
  - Appropriate references;
  - Copy of an original transcript(s) from all college level courses attended; and a
  - Typed, personal statement.
